

In January of this year, we here at the United Methodist Church of Green Valley began living into a new governing structure. We moved from the historic and traditional leadership model of numerous boards and committees to a Simplified Accountable Structure. This simplified accountable structure, also sometimes referred to as a single board model, is designed to be a more nimble and flexible model that frees people to do ministry.

Let me say a bit more about this model. By our book of discipline, we are required to have four primary administrative teams. nominations team, which works to identify leader ship. A staff parish relations committee which deals with personnel matters. A trustees committee, which deals with all matters relating to real property of the local church. And a finance committee, which over sees the financial operations of the church.

How a church chooses to provide for these basic functions is up to the church. In our simplified accountable structure, we have one single board that serves as the staff parish, trustees, and finance committees. The nominations team is separate.

We have nine positions on the board, seven of which are currently filled. Your current leadership team consists of the following members:

As a non profit in the state of Arizona, we are required to elect officers for the corporation commission. That is why we have listed President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Secretary.

I share this with you for a couple of reasons. One, invite you to be in prayer for the leaders of UMCGV, as we grow into this new leadership model, and seek to lead the church where God calls us. We value your prayers. Second, with two vacancies on the board, if you would like to have a conversation about, serving on the Simplified Accountable Board, you can give me a call and we can consider your name in the nominations process.

Next month I will reflect on the various ministries that are a part of our church and the needs going forward.




HOPE is Cancelled for the SUMMER


Please help us get the word out that we will not have HOPE lunch for June and July and August giving the cooks and crew a well deserved break.

Aldersgate Day is celebrated on May 24 (or the Sunday closest) to commemorate the day in 1738 when John Wesley experienced assurance of his salvation. Wesley reluctantly attended a group meeting that evening on Aldersgate Street in London. As he heard a reading from Luther's Preface to the Epistle to the Romans, he felt his "heart strangely warmed." Wesley wrote in his journal that at about 8:45 p.m. "while he was describing the change which God works in the heart through faith in Christ, I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone for salvation; and an assurance was given me that He had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death."

Charles Wesley only a few days before had also had a conversion experience in a building that still stands on an adjacent block (John Bray's house on Little Britain). We do not know whether the building where John Wesley's experience took place still exists, nor exactly in which building on Aldersgate Street it may have been if it still stands. A monument at the London Museum on Aldersgate Street marks where some believe the building may have been.

Over time, Aldersgate Street has been shortened by common Methodist usage to simply Aldersgate. The word has come to represent both the place and John Wesley's experience.

ANTI-TRIANGULATION POLICY

Conflict among Christians is not new. Jesus spoke directly about it in Matthew 18:15-20. It is in the spirit of that text that your Leadership Team has adopted the following policy at our April Board Meeting.

Gossip often finds expression amongst us, in "triangulation," where person (a), upset with person (b), goes to person (c) to complain instead of dealing face to face with person (b).

In keeping with Jesus' teaching, the Leadership Team of UMCGV has adopted the following "Anti-Triangulation Policy."

Suppose you were to call a member of the Leadership Team to complain about someone. You would be asked:

- 1. Have you shared your complaint with the party personally?
- 2. If you are unable or unwilling to share your concern with the party personally, a member of the Leadership Team will offer to go with you to confront the party personally.
- 3. Should you choose neither option 1 or 2, then you will be asked permission for the member of the Leadership Team to convey your complaint to the party, with the understanding that your name would be revealed.
- 4. Should you choose none of the above, then for the sake of our wholeness, you will be expected to keep your complaint to yourself.

I really appreciate this last statement which captures the whole policy. "For the sake of our wholeness" is what it's really all about. Walking through life together can be challenging and even messy, but by Gods grace we can do so in wholeness.
