

Recently, I heard a news headline speaking about the crisis among many in our world, who experience extended periods of isolation and loneliness. The article went on to say, that extended periods of isolation and loneliness can have the same adverse health effects as smoking 15 cigarettes a day. I have since learned the original report came from the U.S. Surgeon General in the spring of 2023. This is astounding to consider. Further learning would reveal that among those who experience some of the greatest amounts of loneliness and isolation are the youth and elderly. Specifically, 6.5 million senior adults experience isolation and often as a result depression.

I'm sure by now many of you are saying, "you are preaching to the choir pastor". I know that many among us know this firsthand. I also recognize the important work you have done to make a difference in this matter. I want to tell you how proud I am of you for some of the steps you are taking to create life giving friendships and connectivity in our community. For a decade now HOPE Lunch has created a place where people can get not only a healthy meal, but a place where people can connect with one another. Our amazing team of folks (that is always open for more servant-volunteers) are always outnumbered by people from the community who do not attend our church. I commend you for this tremendous work and hope and pray we can continue to connect with people in our community.

Like HOPE Lunch our Monday Funday group creates a place where people can simply connect with friends to play board games, to be together, to laugh, to have fun. This ministry of love, like HOPE Lunch is connecting with many from our community who do not attend our church. This past Monday I counted 19 people gathered around four different tables, playing games together. I saw smiles, I heard laughter (among some very competitive faces as well).

Sometimes I think we overthink ministry. We think it needs to be some holy somber activity that we participate in like a Bible study, a new worship service or a prayer group. I think you have shown the way, UMCGV, by simply loving your neighbors. By sharing in some fun, laughter, food, and fellowship you have made lives more full and complete. Keep loving your neighbor, keep inviting people to lunch and Monday Funday and maybe one day even to worship.

I am proud of you church. I give thanks to God for you and the life together we share.






More Our Church



Border Community Alliance

NOGALES CROSS BORDER TOUR...Have you ever been to Nogales, Mexico? If so, have you ever gone past the pharmacies, the dentists, and the souvenir shoes a few blocks away from the wall? If the answer to both

questions is "no," consider going on a Border Community Alliance tour of the city. Nogales, Mexico, has a population of approximately 400,000. There are more than 100 maquiladoras (US-owned factories) in the city. Thousands of people and an enormous amount of commerce go through the ports of entry everyday – legally and safely. The tour includes visits to some of the nonprofits, as well as an overview of Nuevo Nogales ("New Nogales") to get a sense of how dynamic the city really is, despite all the bad press. Cross Border tours start in Tubac with a brief orientation, followed by a short drive to Nogales, Arizona, where we park and walk across "the line" to a van with a professional driver on the Mexican side. Expert guidance is provided by Alma Cota, an amazing leader and teacher. The tour ends at La Roca Restaurant with coffee and flan and a chance to talk with a member of the U.S. Consulate staff. <u>Upcoming tour dates are February 6 and February 15.</u> You can register by calling 520.398.3229 or going online to bordercommunityalliance.org/tours. *Jerry Haas, BCA Senior Advisor, 520.449.0327*
