Each year the Green Valley Community Church Foundation awards two and four year college scholarships to graduating high school seniors and seminary students.

- Recipients must be from the Sahuarita Unified School District or have been an active member of the UMC of Green Valley for over two years.
- Awards are based on their GPA and financial need.
- Each potential recipient is interviewed by a Sub-Committee from the Foundation.
- The scholarship is continued as long as the requirements and GPA are met each semester.
- Seminary scholarships are also awarded to students residing in the Desert Southwest Conference and continue as long as standards are met.

What is the Foundation?

The Green Valley Community Church Foundation, Inc. is a tax exempt 501c3 corporation organized and operated for the support of educational, religious or charitable purposes of the United Methodist Church of Green Valley.

Why Was the Foundation Formed?

The Foundation was formed to receive gifts and grants of money and/or property and to manage such assets as directed by the donor, subject to any limitations as prescribed by law. The Foundation provides the donor a way to preserve his or her gift so it can keep on giving.

How is the Foundation Managed?

The business affairs of the Foundation are managed by a board of directors, composed of members of the United Methodist Church of Green Valley. Directors are elected by the board for a term of three years, and may serve up to two consecutive terms. The Foundation is a corporation, separate from the United Methodist Church of Green Valley.

How Can Gifts be Made?

- **Outright Gift...** These can include cash, stocks, bonds automobiles, trucks or real estate.
- **Real Estate...** A gift of a personal residence or farm may be made to the Foundation now, while you continue to live there, or through your will at death.
- **Gift Annuity...** You may transfer property (cash, securities, etc.) to the Foundation while retaining the right to receive the income while alive. After death the remaining property will go to the Foundation.
- **Retirement Funds...** The Foundation may be named as a contingent beneficiary of retirement accounts to succeed other family members.
- **Life Insurance...** The Foundation can be named as owner, beneficiary, or partial beneficiary. It can also be a contingent beneficiary to receive the proceeds if family members do not survive the insured.
- **Memorials...** A gift to the Foundation can be placed in memory of a loved one who has passed.
- **Honoraria...** Gifts are also accepted in honor of a family member, serviceperson, or any other individual you wish to acknowledge.
