

Looking back, I celebrate especially the ministries among us that have been born. The refugee resettlement ministry helped the Morales family, a family of 4 from Guatemala get settled here in Tucson from greeting them at the airport, to furnishing their new apartment and finding a new life here. The Refugee Resettlement Team will reconvene in January to look ahead to 2024.

I give thanks and celebrate the tremendous work of the Caring through Dementia Team. Born out of a book study in 2022, we have continued hosting, learning and networking opportunities for the community each month. In November we had our first Memory Cafe. A time for those with dementia and their caregivers to come together for fellowship and support. This ministry has been funded by a grant from the Pima Council on Aging. I give thanks to God for this work among us.

I give thanks to God for the ways this church has remained committed to the community and creating community. HOPE Lunch has served approximately 1500 meals this year and continues to be an important part of life together.

A new ministry committed to creating community has also come to be in Monday Funday. Simply bringing people together for friendship and fun, this ministry of pure fun and games brings people together each week in Johnson Hall.

As we look ahead to 2024, what ministries will be born? That is yet to be seen. I eagerly await with hope as we welcome the new year together. United Methodist Church of Green Valley, I am proud to be your pastor!






Come learn more about us and what it means to be a United Methodist and about our church.





United Methodist Boot Camp Scheduled for January 25, 2024

You're invited to become a new or returning veteran of UMCGV's United Methodist Boot Camp on Thursday, **January 25, 2024.**

The group will be called to attention at 9:00 a.m. and dismissed at noon (0900 and 1200 boot camp time) with adequate food rations (coffee, lemonade, and edible snacks) available.

The "camp" provides an overview of the history, organizational structure, and the many opportunities for service and witness available at UMC of Green Valley.

Boot Camp will try to answer such questions as the following: "Who is John Wesley and why are we always talking about him?" "How did we get to be The *United* Methodist Church?" "What's a *Book of Discipline* and why does it matter?" And, with the advent of the Global Methodist Church (GMC), what's ahead for the way the UMC will continue in the UMC's mission of making disciples for Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world?

The Boot Camp is a great orientation for new members or those thinking about joining our church. It is also an excellent refresher course for the more seasoned "troops" who may also want to learn more about the opportunities ahead as the UMC transitions into new and continued organizational and missional operations.

All those attending previous Boot Camps (pre-COVID) have agreed it was time well spent. Doris Miller will once again act as your drill sergeant (course facilitator). Caring through Dementia ...a ministry of UMC-GV

Beginning more than 12 months ago, with a study group and a task force, our program on dementia has now hosted more than twenty resource sessions with doctors, social workers, lawyers, caregivers, and counselors. Our church's website includes a section dedicated to this ministry (https://www.umcgv.org/caring-




through-dementia). Participants from the church and the community have access to a significant amount of information about dementia, including resources to provide support for families and persons with this disorder. The Stress-Busting Program for Family Caregivers has been offered twice, and plans are to develop additional leaders for this wonderful support program. In November we held our first Esperanza Memory Café, thanks to Pima Council on Aging, and with grant funding from them, we'll continue to offer this experience (see the flyer on the following page with a list of upcoming Memory Cafes).

Beginning in January and continuing through 2024, Esperanza Memory Cafe will be held on the second Thursday of the month. Caring thru Dementia, featuring presentations by resource people (social workers, doctors, etc.) will be offered on the fourth Thursday of every month.

The next meeting of Caring thru Dementia will be January 25, at 2:00 pm. Our speaker is Carri Tanner, who works for United Cerebral Palsy (UCP), an organization that provides a broad spectrum of services to people of all ages living with disabilities. According to their brochure, up to 70% of the individuals served by UCP in Southern Arizona have a diagnosis other than cerebral palsy. No stranger to this church, Carri's mother was Jill McNeil, a member of this church who passed away a few years ago. Border Community Alliance was started ten years ago with a mission of "bridging the border and fostering community through education, collaboration and cultural exchange." BCA offers tours, forums, classes on Spanish conversation, a book club, and a summer student intern program. BCA also has a Mexico Pass Through program, whereby you can make a tax-deductible donation to a worthy project in Mexico that has been carefully vetted. In 2023, more than \$72,000 has been donated through BCA to support geriatric centers, a wheelchair factory, migrant shelters, organizations that work with children and youth, and many other projects.


