

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

What a great celebration it was! On Sunday January 28, we celebrated the 60th Anniversary of our first worship service held in 1964. It was a great day for which I am thankful to Jean Neely and her team of faithful volunteers. As we reflected on our beginnings, I wonder if the first participants in that first worship service imagined us being where we are today? I don't expect they could have dreamt that our community would be nearly 60,000 people between Green Valley and Sahuarita. I don't imagine that they could have ever conceived of online worship, that is, between 50-100 people watching church online every week. Could they have ever conceived of ministries like HOPE lunch feeding over 200 people each month? Did they dream of a Caring Through Dementia ministry or Refugee Resettlement ministry? Did they even dream of a church that would one day start a second church in the Green Valley/Sahuarita area? It has been guite a road that the saints have traveled over the years.



It leads me to wonder what the next 60 years will hold? It is very exciting to consider, yet overwhelming at the same time. None of us will be here 60 years from now, but I do trust that the church in some form will be. Do you believe that? The church was born at Pentecost with the coming of the holy spirit over the disciples that had gathered together in Jerusalem. That means this thing called the church, was God's idea.

We have the opportunity to plant seeds today that will harvested tomorrow. What are the seeds you are planting that will bear the fruit of the future? Sixty years from now, what will they say about us when they look back to 2024? I pray that those who look back will see our hope for the future, and our faithfulness to the work of the church.

Slowly our church moved in the direction of SAS and last October our Church Conference implemented our first steps which included electing a Leadership Team. Our church is no longer "slowed down" by endless meetings but is instead working toward becoming even more answerable and subsequently freeing added church members for ministry in the community as well as missions in our world.

General Conference Presentation

March 10 and 24 at 9:00 am in the Sunday School Room (between services)

Many UM's recognize that the United Methodist Church is quite methodical, planning and organizing everything ahead of time. Among the tools we use for planning is the General Conference, a global meeting that happens every four years (unless COVID intervenes). The next General Conference will happen in Charlotte, NC this spring. Over eight hundred delegates from around the world will gather to decide on organization, policy and theology matters. Importantly, only the General Conference may speak for the church; not an individual member, pastor or Bishop.

Essentially, General Conference edits two of our most important books, The Book of Discipline and the Book of Resolutions. The Discipline contains the organizational and policy requirements of the UMC and how we do them, while the Book of Resolutions holds the collection of material that describes the UMC's position on a wide variety of issues important to society. Both of these books are changed regularly by the General Conference.

We will be offering an opportunity to hear more about General Conference for all those interested, including how delegates are chosen, how the meetings are run and expectations for the Charlotte meeting. Plan now to attend information sessions during the nine AM hour on two Sundays, March 10 and 24. Jim Nibbelink, who has been a delegate to General Conference six times will share "what it is and how it works" for us. In addition, Jim will review another conference of the UMC, the Jurisdictional Conference, which also meets every four years and is responsible for electing Bishops for the church. Questions will be welcomed, so come and join us to learn and to explore these vital aspects of your church!




Financial Preparing for the Last Chapter March 20, 2024 at 10:00 am



Is God Calling You to Service at Your Church?

An Introduction to Lay Servant Ministries class is being offered Saturdays, **May 4th and 11th** at St John's UMC in Tucson (from 9 am to 3 pm both days). Upon registration, more detailed information about the class will be provided. Registration is open at:

Lay Servant Ministries is a program to educate and empower the laity to roles of leadership, caring and communications in the church and community.

The first class in "Introduction to Lay Servant Ministries" is offered 4-5 times a year in the conference. Also offered are Advanced Courses that cover many topics of interest in our three focus areas of leadership, caring and communications. One is allowed to take advanced courses at any time, although we do encourage the Introduction (Basic) class first. Each course is 10 hours in length and can be in 3.5 hour sessions or two 5 hour sessions (or other appropriate timeframe. This will be described in the advertisement and registration document. Attendance at all class times is mandatory for credit to be given.

Once the Introduction class and one Advanced course are taken, one is designated a Certified Lay Servant. An Annual report is required each Fall and is due to your church for your annual church conference which is usually held in the fall. A requirement of completing at least one Advanced Course every 3 years is also required to maintain status.


Openings: A Writing Retreat for Connecting


Our Guide
